From News paper reports we gather that once a popular idea/generally accepted solution is submitted to the Govt. it should be left over it to form a policy/plan/ordinance/Act on that with the consultation and acceptance of all the parties and interests involved. The Women's Reservation Bill or Lokpal Bill are such examples. But the Govt. Finds it difficult to develop consensus on what public wishes or what is in the interest of general public.

The conclusion which public derive is that within the present system, formation of a new authority to control or improve functioning of Govt. is quite difficult.

However my society has developed a paper on "Taxation **and civic system reforms in India**" which are enclosed herewith for your kind perusal and discussion among different government functionaries. The reformations are such that on formulation they might attract least opposition as beside public they are also in the interest and for the benefit of Govt. machinery & political leaders.
